- Matches both forage oats and triticale
- Late Flowering

Growth Habit:

Compass has several unique characteristics that make it an excellent winter forage pea. Compass is the quickest to establish ground cover with the best seedling vigor when compared to other forage/BioCrop™ and wildlife peas.

Since Compass is a white flowered pea it allows the plant to be more digestible and palatable. It has a strong root system and can be blended with other crops without dominating the blend.

Compass is excellent as a forage pea when planted alone and good when planted with forage oats or triticale.
